**CALIFORNIA BAR ASSOCIATION EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENT FOR CERTIFICATION AS AN IMMIGRATION SPECIALIST:

An applicant must show that, within the three years immediately preceding the application for certification, he or she has completed not less than 45 hours of educational activities specifically approved for immigration and nationality law, as follows:

- Immigrant Visas (minimum of 15 hours required)
- Non-Immigrant Visas (minimum of 8 hours required)
- Removal/Deportation/Exclusion Procedures (minimum of 12 hours required)
- Administrative and Judicial Review (minimum of 6 hours required)
- Citizenship and Naturalization (minimum of 4 hours required)
